



Community Supported Reentry Program

The Community Supported Reentry Program (CSRP) is run by the Missoula County Sheriff's Office within the detention facility. The CSRP was developed to assist in reducing the pretrial population within the detention facility and provide innovative strategies to address the high demand, high needs offender population by accessing services available within the community.

Target Population: The CSRP targets individuals who are not participating in a Pre-trial Release Program or currently supervised on Parole or Probation. Program eligibility is extended to defendants charged with a non-violent felony or misdemeanor offense. The program will focus on Native American adults, female adults, and individuals that have established a pattern of frequent interaction with the criminal justice system.

CSRP Team: The CSRP Team is made up of a Reentry Coordinator, a Reentry Program Specialist, a Native American Peer Support Program Specialist, and a Licensed Clinical Social Worker/Licensed Addiction Counselor. Team members will screen eligible inmates in jail using the CSRP Intake Needs Assessment Screening Tool. The screening tool will assist in determining a defendant's immediate needs. An Individualized Reentry Plan (IRP) will be created for each participant based upon information provided during the initial interview. Staff will work collaboratively with community-based providers to transition a defendant from detention to community-based services that meet participant treatment needs/goals. The IRP will serve as a multidisciplinary plan setting realistic short- and long-term goals for addressing participant needs while housed in the community pending court proceedings. Needs may include but are not limited to:

• Housing stabilization	• Health benefits
• Medication management	• Mental health services
• Substance abuse	• Academic/vocational programs

Release from Custody to Community Procedures: Upon release, contact is made with program participants and community-based providers no less than two times each week (via telephone, online or in person meetings) to monitor participant progress. CSRP staff and community-based program providers work collaboratively to provide much of the case management needs for participants.

Program Completion: The goal of the CSRP is to return a defendant to the community as they progress through court proceedings and connect them with community-based program providers to meet their needs and assist them to remain free from future criminal behavior. Participants who maintain placement in the community, avoid reoffending or being rearrested, and meet their obligation to attend court proceedings will be considered as having completed the CSRP successfully.

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
